



## Grading

UT's Medical Radiography Program follows the following Grading Scale for all program related courses (RADT prefix):

## Progression in the Program

Due to the uniqueness of the profession of radiography, close patient contact and responsibilities of the radiographer, a high level of academic and clinical competence is required of all students in the program. Therefore, students must receive no less than a final grade of **C- (76)** to meet minimal standards in the academic and clinical course work. This includes all medical radiography courses (those with RADT prefix). If a student receives a final grade lower than a **C-** in a didactic course, he/she will not be able to continue in the program. The student may reenter the program in the semester which the course that was not passed is offered. A student receiving below a **C-** in a clinical course may be allowed to continue in the didactic portion of the course work while repeating the failed clinical course. This would delay graduation for the student.
